Goldsborough and Flaxby Grouped Parish Council (GFPC)

Planning matters - The following are new or updates on existing planning applications (excluding tree works and enforcements) in or close to our two Parishes, since 31st March 2022:

Garden outbuildings and external works changes to Stone Cottage, Station Road, Goldsborough. Harrogate Borough Council (HBC) approved this on 25 February 2022

9 Eco-custom self-build dwellings at York Road, Flaxby - Following HBC's refusal of this, the applicant submitted an appeal to the Planning Inspectorate. The Inspectorate also refused this application. Subsequently the applicant has resubmitted to HBC a revised scheme comprising **5 self-build houses** that will be Passivhaus (ie. extremely energy efficient).

At the same time, the applicant has submitted an application for a **Nature Reserve to the rear of Woodland View** in Flaxby. The Parish Council will be submitting comments in due course, and residents have until 4 August 2022 to submit their own comments on both applications.

First floor extension over existing double garage at 3 Goldsborough Court, Goldsborough. This application has been withdrawn

Replacement of a temporary single storey unit with a larger single storey permanent building to serve as a dayroom with small gymnasium at The Green Paddock, (immediate north west side of A59 roundabout from Goldsborough). HBC approved this on 22 April 2022 but with strict conditions that it shall not be sold, let or used separately otherwise than by members of the family of the occupiers for the time being.

Rear single storey extension to Middle Farm, Church Street, Goldsborough. The PC had no objections to this. HBC approved it on 19 May 2022.

Erection of 1.7m high curved boundary wall with gate at the Post Office Cottage, Church Street, Goldsborough. This work replaces an existing conifer hedge. The PC submitted comments about the new wall to HBC on 20 May 2022. HBC has not yet made a decision. It is understood that permitted development allows the wall to be built up to 1m high without planning permission.

Environmental impact assessment for a proposed new Asphalt Plant next to the Allerton Incinerator. North Yorkshire County Council asked the PC to comment on this by 22 June 2022. The PC did so, listing many environmental concerns and objecting to it being built. The PC has received no reply yet from NYCC.

Single storey extension (approx. 700m²) to the Ilke Homes factory at Flaxby Moor. The PC has been asked by HBC to respond about this by 16 July 2022.

Goldsborough School

The children have been busy as always in school! Our Class 4 children (Year 5 and 6) attended a 5-day residential trip just before Easter and all really enjoyed the activities on offer, and the chance to learn new skills. Shortly after returning to school after Easter, our choir took part in the prestigious Young Voices event at Sheffield Arena. The children sang and danced beautifully to a full house! SATs week at the beginning of May saw our Year 6 children tested on numeracy, literacy, reading etc and the results will be given to parents in July. The Y2 children also took part in their SATs too. All the children worked really hard to do their very best work.

The week after SATs, Year 6 took part in Bikeability - you may have seen the children and tutors cycling around the village. Bikeability teaches children how to safely navigate roads, other road users, and also basic bike maintenance. The tutors are professionals from North Yorkshire County Council.

All children took part in a Jubilee Picnic lunch on 19 May dressed in Red, White and Blue - fortunately the weather was good so all the children (and the food) were taken over to the cricket field for the special event. The children have also taken part in Jubilee activities in school, such as Jubilee Art Work and portraits of the Queen. They also decorated the school railings with bunting to celebrate this special occasion too. The children finished the half term off with a brilliant 'Break the Rules Day' organised by FROGS - the school PTA!

School Council have been hard at work making impressive changes to school - they re-established the House Point System with new names based on their chosen inspirational people who were then voted for by the classes. The winning House names now in place are: Attenborough, Jemison, Hawking and Lovelace. School Council launched a competition for the children to design the House Shields! The winning designs are currently being computerised by a Graphic Designer. They have also followed the same process to rename the classes as they found the year group and class numbers confusing eg. Year 6 were in Class 4. They wanted the classes to be named after trees and so we now have Monkey Puzzle Class (EYFS), Sweet Chestnut (Year 1 and 2), Sycamore (Year 3 and 4) and Oak (Year 5 and 6).

And now we are into the final few weeks of the school year. Our Year 6 children will be leaving in July, to make way for our new 4-year-olds who will be joining us for their moving up dates very soon ahead of coming to our school in September. This term promises to be a busy one, with lots of exciting events and trips planned.
